Walker Hill & Corner Cafe

Recap by Gwyneth Shotwell

We started off our 2025 Lunch Bunch series with a wonderful tour organized by Steve and Ardith Vied. After meeting up in Fayetteville (after one couple mistakenly went to the WRONG location!) we took a really lovely drive to Griffin to visit historic Walker Hill. The home was built in 1867 and was purchased in 1905 by the Walker family. It was run as a dairy until 1933 when it became the permanent residence of the Walker family. We were privileged to have Mr. Walker's great-grandson, Ron Walker, as our informative and enthusiastic guide.

Ron's mother and his Uncle Charles grew up in the house, and went on to care for and nurture the property. Charles was a natural collector, and eventually built a large "barn" to house artifacts depicting life in the South of a bygone era. Set up as a series of vignettes, we saw vintage phones, toys Charlie had played with, a wonderful musical instrument reminiscent of a pipe organ called a Chrysglott, rare kitchen gadgets, and more. But the centerpiece of this wonderful museum is the Little Beauty wooden carved Carousel in the very center of it all.

Charlie restored the carousel as a labor of love over many years, even being featured in a local TV news story back in the 1980s. With fewer wooden, hand-carved examples remaining, this is a true treasure. And several of us took a ride, complete with music and lights. It was delightful.

Afterwards, we took a short drive to Zebulon to have lunch at the Corner Café. Our group of 16 became 19 as we were met there by the Tylers, and Kevin Moss. There was lively conversation, tasty food, a fabulous waitress who felt like an old friend, and a yummy dessert case that several folks took advantage of for take-home goodies. All in all, a wonderful day. Thanks again to the Vieds!

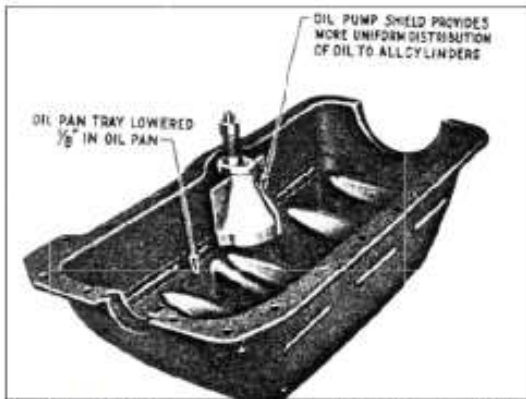


The Tech Corner

Oil Pump Change

by Tom Endy

Ford made a change to the oil pump and the dipper tray in late summer of 1931. According to the service bulletin the reason was to lessen oil consumption.



Service Bulletin, page 576, for July/August 1931:

“An Improvement to lessen oil consumption: A shield is provided that fits around the oil pump and assures a more even distribution of oil to all the cylinders. The oil pan tray has also been lowered by $\frac{1}{8}$ ” and is accomplished by raising the bead in the oil pan tray.”



The shield that fits around the oil pump



The bottom dipper tray is the modified one with the bead raised $\frac{1}{8}$ ” along the edge of the tray to lower it in the pan. The dipper tray at top is the original with the bead in the center.

Common wisdom has it that if you are going to use the oil pump shield you must use the corresponding modified dipper tray.



The engine in this 1931 wide bed pick-up was found to have the oil pump shield installed, but not a modified dipper tray. The shield was removed from the pump.

From Joe Valentine, President and Jim Zimmer, Director of Regions

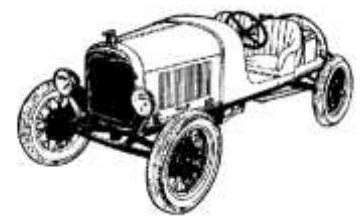
March 2025

While this pair of men's shoes is typical for the time period and seem nice enough, the only new aspect is that they are now offered in navy blue in addition to the usual black or brown. Is this flamboyant enough to earn a Whoopee appellation?

The men's wool hat to the right first appears to be shapeless and without spark, but imagine it in Royal blue, light green, red or purple! Maybe it has earned its Whoopee title after all, but I wonder just how many were sold or worn in public. Both of these listings are from National Bella Hess Co. Spring & Summer 1930.

The Up-to-Date "Crusher"

68V129 — Buy yourself a "Whoopee" Hat if you want to be up-to-date. Men's "crusher" Hat of good quality soft Wool Felt. You can roll it up and put it in your pocket without doing it a bit of damage. Has medium high crown and 2 1/4 inch brim. Narrow grosgrain ribbon band as pictured; durable sweat-band. COLORS: brown, black, grey, Royal blue, light green, red or purple. SIZES: 6 1/2 to 7 1/2. OUR PRICE, —and we pay postage. 98¢



Conclusion

I hope you got a kick out of my casual sampling of Model A clothing ads. Interestingly, I didn't find any ads for women's dresses, pants or pajamas using the term Whoopee. And definitely not a single ad for any women's step-ins, bloomers, or any kind of underwear or union suit for women or men. Was "Whoopee Style" a distinctive style in the Model A years? I highly doubt it, but the catch phrase absolutely got my attention!

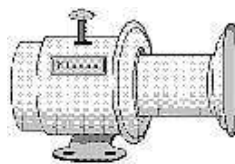
