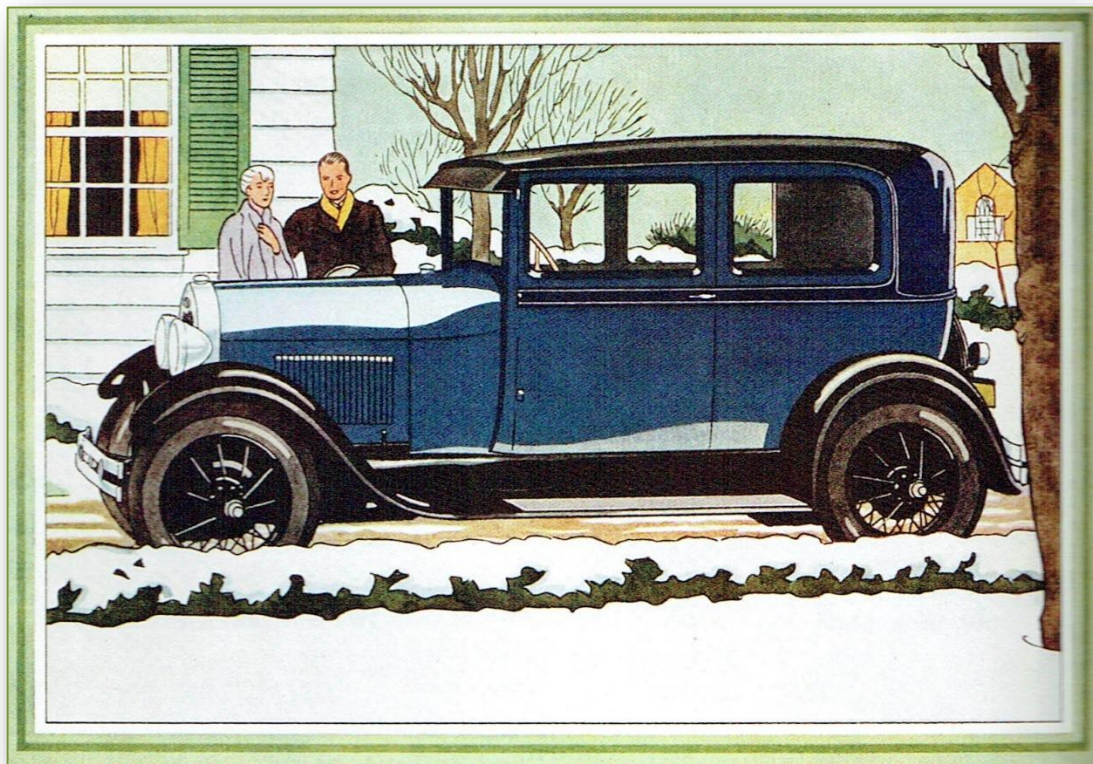

Biltmore Estate Tour

November 21-23, 2015

November tours in Model A's are not a common occurrence, what with unpredictable weather and the chance for at least some pretty low temperatures. But that did not hinder five drivers from taking friends and family from the Fayetteville area up to Asheville, North Carolina. Dick Carne, Jason Carne, Jim Wingo, James Wingo, and Tom Romine, guided their lovely cars along the back roads to the Clarion Inn just outside of Asheville proper. They were greeted by those of us who chose to drive "modern," with hearty hello's and pats on the back.

Our group was a happy mix of very young (still in diapers), to young adults, and the rest of us! The Wingo's kids, James and Kimmie were joined by Meagan and Dennis, and Cynthia Williams brought baby Easton, who was quite content to be held by many admirers and driven around in modern cars so his mom could ride with Grandpa Dick in the A. Liz

Romine also enjoyed the creature comforts of the beautiful Victoria, made so by talented Tom, for the tour up from Fayetteville, and back.

The next day we headed out to go see a small but special car collection owned by a long-time friend of Dick's. Marvin Floren and his wife Paula own the collection with Marvin's brother, Roger and his wife Judy. (a fun aside...Roger is the attorney who made the motion for Dick's admittance to the U.S. Supreme Court some 32 years ago) We all admired the varied automobiles and enjoyed hearing Marvin describe their histories and the things he loved about each one, including his apparent pleasure with how downright unwieldy a couple of them were to drive. But the guys really liked looking into the details under the hoods; by all accounts that was perhaps the most interesting part of the visit.

On we went further into Asheville, to the site of the Grove Park Inn set in a hilly, wooded area. The main attraction was a lovely antique car collection housed in a building that once served Biltmore Industries as a woolen mill. Edith Vanderbilt, the mistress of Biltmore House, believed strongly in providing practical training to the children of those working on the estate, so they might have skills with which to earn a living. It became very successful, with fine wool being produced along with products utilizing carpentry skills.



We all enjoyed studying the cars on display, as well as reading the inspirational inscriptions that could be seen on all the exposed beams above our heads. The blasting heaters were a nice touch, too!



That afternoon, some folks rested up in the hotel in preparation for the evening's tour of the House, while others ventured onto the estate grounds to visit the winery and drive through the extensive property. Besides the landscaping, both formal and natural, we saw cornfields that were evidence of the agriculture that existed during the time of the Vanderbilts, and continues today.

By late afternoon we had gathered outside Biltmore House awaiting our assigned tour time, visiting and keeping warm in the hallways of the charming shops adjacent to the entry.



To try to describe what we saw would be a monumental task, and could never really convey it all. But suffice to say it is a magnificent feast for the eyes, especially decorated as it was for Christmas. This was a "candlelight tour," so the lighting was low, but it enhanced the overall feel. A choir performed Christmas songs in the central hall surrounded by lush plants and holiday trim. The banquet hall contained a 70-foot tall

tree, decorated with 500 lights, 500 ornaments, and 500 presents (a common custom at that time); and we learned that halfway through the two-month holiday showing, they remove the tree and all the trimmings in early December, after they close around 10 PM, and bring in a fresh tree, which is re-decorated completely, ready for the doors to open the next morning.

George Vanderbilt's spacious library, the various sitting and living rooms, guest quarters, guest living room, the bowling alley, the swimming pool and changing rooms, the servant's rooms, kitchen, etc., in all, a seven-story, 175,000 sq. foot architectural masterpiece, was remarkable to see.



And even though this is definitely living on a grand scale, it also felt like a home in which you could imagine people carrying on their (special) daily lives. I was struck many times by the grand but livable proportions of so many of the rooms; and the wing that housed the individual bedrooms of Mr. and Mrs. Vanderbilt, connected by a warm "family room" in between, also felt like a private area that would have felt cozy, complete with views out to open vistas.

This was, indeed, a wonderful tour. Thanks go to both Dick and Jason Carne for spearheading and organizing what was a very special



weekend. All who attended were grateful, as well, to see Dick and family members immersed in the hobby that means so much to us, as we remembered and felt Jane's presence.

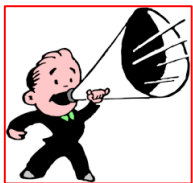

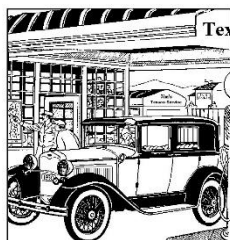


MODEL A YOUTH RESTORATION AWARD (MAYRA):

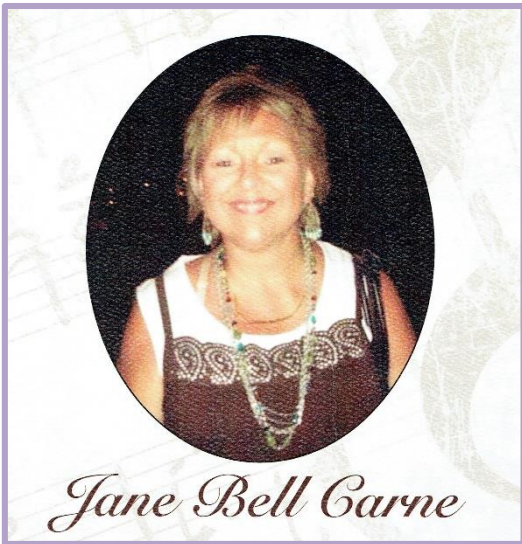

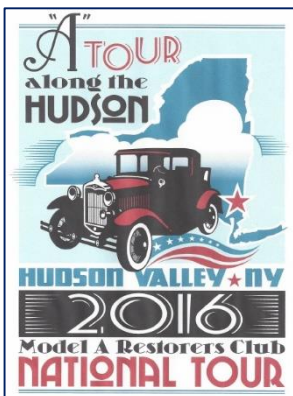
