"Technical O & A"

Many articles have been written on the operation and maintenance of the Model A Ford. Here is a short cut to Starting the car, especially after the car has been parked overnight.

Startup:

- 1- Place the transmission in Neutral.
- 2- Put both control levers (behind steering wheel) in the full upward position.
- 3- Pull the gas lever (the one on the right) down just until you see the gas pedal move.
- 4- Reach under the gas tank on the right side of the car and turn the gas valve on-downward.
- 5- Turn the ignition switch to on.
- 6- The carb enrichment doubles as the choke, turn this to the right, until it stops turning, then back to the left ½ turn.
- 7- Pull the choke lever out and hold it out. (Cold Starting Only)
- 8- Push the starter pedal down. -Hold choke until the engine fires, usually within 3 seconds.
- 9- As soon as the engine fires, push the choke back down.
- 10- When the engine begins running, you can push the gas lever back upward.
- 11- As the engine warms up, pull the spark lever (the lever on the left) down about halfway.
- 12- Keep the spark lever about 2 clicks from the bottom for normal driving.
- 13- Spark lever may be pulled all the way down for high speed driving- over 45 mph only.

Shut down:


- 1-Put both levers in the full upward position.
- 2- Reach under the tank and turn the gas valve off- lever will be sideways, toward the left.
- 3- Pull the parking brake lever
- 4- Turn the ignition switch off
- 5- Check the lights to make sure they are off- light switch should be straight down.

I usually give a copy of this information to any of my customers who may need it. Your car starting procedure may be different in some ways, but this will usually get you up and running. Have fun in those A's and let's get ready for some good trips.


Swap Meet in Marietta - February 11-12:

It's Jasper ArtFest time again in North Georgia, April 21:






