Highlights from the January Board Meeting

The Southside Model A's December Board Meeting was held on January 2, 2013 at the Los Mariachis Restaurant in Fairburn.

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 PM by Co-Director Jim Johnston. The following members were present: Gwyneth and Mike Shotwell, Betty Miller, Pat Tyler, Tom and Liz Romine, Kathy and Fred Huey, Jackie and Larry Peterson, Jim Johnston, Kathy and Phil Meyers, Jim Wingo, Dick and Jane Carne.

 The Treasurer's report was made by Betty Miller, current account balance is \$1,259.86 as of December 31, 2012. Dues have been collected on 32 out of 49 members for 2013 as of December 31st.

Committee Chair Reports

- Corresponding Secretary's report made by G.
 Shotwell Model A news report was made for the January/February submission to the MARC. Newsletters have been mailed out to other clubs.
- Activities T. Romine stated that no changes have been made to the tentative activities plan.
 Phil mentioned that we are going forward with the Valentine Sweetheart Tour, venue to be decided.
- Membership by Jim Johnston for Jackie -New member application for approval John Keller was submitted and approved. John will be our 50th member. Please review the new rosters and make certain that your distribution lists are updated.
- Newsletter by G. Shotwell was submitted and sent to all members for January. Jim raised the question of "non-club" events being submitted and accepted by the newsletter. It was generally agreed that non-club events should not normally be reported in the newsletter, as all membership should be involved in reported events. However, the final decision should be

made by the Editor of the Newsletter based on the specifics of the event.

- Tech Activities See new business below
- Fashion Kathie Meyers has accepted the Fashion Chair and encourages everyone to think about getting involved in dressing in era clothing periodically. She will be submitting ideas and articles for this component of the club's activities. A question was raised by Kathie on the amount and frequency of fashion articles needed to achieve awards for the newsletter. Model A News can be used as a source for these articles.
- Phone Tree Larry Peterson mention that there is a service called "A Calling Post" that can be used for this service. Merle Bennett is currently handling this and Jim Johnston will check with Merle on whether he should continue. Dick Carne mentioned that we should attempt to assign different members a short list of names to call before each event. This will be discussed with the wider group at the Dinner and a Movie event later this month.
- Website Pat Tyler was instrumental in designing and implementing the new website that will be launched at the Dinner and a Movie event at Tom and Betty's house later this month. Mike Shotwell will work with Pat on design elements and content that will be coming from the newsletter and other sources. Pat will fill the new 'Webmaster' Chairperson slot.
- Activities Schedule Dinner and a Movie on January 26th at Tom and Betty Millers' house at 5:00 PM. The movie will be "The World's Fastest Indian". Everyone should bring a desert to share and their own drinks of choice. The Sweetheart's Tour on February 16 is on and Phil Meyers will be putting out information on this tour in the next few weeks. Talladega Speedway tour will be March 15, 16th and applications are available in the Newsletter.

Dick Carne will accept the Activities Chair in 2013, and share this position with Tom Romine. He asked the board to make certain that he have

the authority to maintain certain level of planning and oversight of each event with the sponsors of each event. Dick will determine the driving guidelines for each event based on the number of cars involved and the miles driven. Dick and Tom Romine will develop these guidelines and submit it to the Directors for review.

• Printing and Mailing of the Newsletter – G. Shotwell mentioned that we will print a limited number for members that don't have e-mail. These copies are currently estimated at \$4 each for printing. Dick Carne mentioned that Jason Carne may be willing to take this over for Eugene Willingham, Dick will ask.

New Business

- Tech Chair It was decided that the question of how to handle technical events and the best way forward on a Technical Chair will be discussed at the Dinner and a Movie event among the larger group of members. Several ideas were floated on having a committee or having a coordinator of getting tech events set up.
- MARC Region Renewal will be submitted.
- MAFCA Affiliation G. Shotwell made a
 presentation on the benefits of being part of this
 larger national club. There are possible
 insurance benefits and advantages in
 developing content for the website. This club is
 about twice the size of MARC in membership.
 Board Members would need to be a member of
 MAFCA, but the remaining membership would

not. A vote was held and the Board approved the go ahead to affiliate with MAFCA for (1) yr. trial period. After this period a decision to continue this practice will be made by the membership.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:52 PM. The next meeting will be held on February 6th at the Los Mariachis Restaurant in Fairburn, the board meeting starts at 7 pm and dinner at 6 pm.





House Bill 386 - New Title Tax



There was some consternation recently when we received some information from the Fayette County Tax Commissioner regarding the new "Title Tax" taking effect on March 1, 2013. Vehicles purchased on or after this date will be required to pay the new title tax, based on the fair market value (not the sales price) of the vehicle, at the initial rate for 2013 of 6.5%. You no longer pay the annual ad valorem tax.

The concern was whether we in the Model A and classic car hobby would be subject to this tax, and how the "fair market value" would be determined when there is such variation in condition among these cars. Well, not to worry. This new law does not pertain to vehicles manufactured prior to 1963, which are not issued titles in the state of Georgia.





The Tech Corner

Changing to Ethanol-Free Fuel

Wanted to touch base with my Model A Friends, and let you know that we have switched to Ethanol Free Fuel for all the Model A's that come out of our shop. I found a station locally through a website called Pure-Gas.org.

Just click on www.pure-gas.org then click on the state of GA, and you can find lots of stations around that offer Ethanol Free fuel, perfect for our antique cars. If there is not a station close to you, then put a 5 gallon can in the trunk of your modern car and pick up some ethanol free fuel when you are out and about, and happen to be near a station.

To switch out your fuel, go for a nice, long drive in your Model A, and drive it until the "0" shows in the gas gage. Drive a little further, to get as much of the old gas out as possible, then pour in your 5 gallons of Ethanol Free. You will be surprised how much better your Antique Car will run. It's like you have tuned up your engine, and added about 20% more power. The car will start quicker, idle smoother, and get better mileage to boot.

The biggest advantage is, the Ethanol Free fuel will last indefinitely in your gas tank, and will not turn to the acidic syrup that attacks your carburetor and fuel system. Ethanol free fuel is about 35 cents a gallon more expensive, but well worth it to us old car enthusiasts. It's also perfect for lawn mowers, and other power equipment that may sit for months unused.

Note: We just discovered the BP at Tyrone Rd. and Hwy. 74 has Ethanol Free Gas, with the pump well labeled.


Expert Chauffeur, Pat Tyler:

SOUTHSIDE STYLES By Kathie Meyers, Fashion Chair




For fifteen years now, Phil and I have been having a great time riding around in "Hazel Rae", our 1930 Model A. Phil has worn a "period" outfit from time to time and during all these years, I have not! (Other than one year I made myself a dress for an evening event that was fun to wear but would have been too hot for daytime summer driving.) When Tom Miller approached me last month to delve into the fashions of the era, I decided it must be time to get serious and come up with an outfit to wear which is appropriate to Hazel Rae's time! So I have been digging into Era Fashions from 1928 through 1931. There is so much information available and I'm looking forward to sharing ideas and sources with you. My personal goal is to sew some sort of a dress and get some

comfortable, appropriate shoes to wear with it. I hope to encourage you all to join me in the process.

Some of our members are to be congratulated as they have already enthusiastically put together some wonderful outfits! They have sewn them, or have used modern pieces with a vintage look or have purchased actual vintage clothing and accessories. Throughout the next few months the column's focus will be on ladies' fashions with an emphasis on patterns available to have garments made for us. If you don't sew, don't worry about that. As soon as this broken foot is fully healed, I plan to do some legwork to look into seamstresses available along with pricing estimates to help us each come up with a plan!

Our first step is to decide what style of dress we each prefer. Would you rather have a dropwaist design, or a style which emphasizes the actual waistline? What length do you like best? In making these decisions, I plan to totally ignore the actual year of our car and go with the fashion style I desire. You can certainly be driving a 1930 car and being wearing your shorter 1925-26 flapper dress if you'd like, or you can be driving the same 1930 car many years later, wearing your 1935 dress! This is all about having fun in our cars, while adding to the fun by dressing in vintage-like wear and being comfortable in so doing! Speaking of comfort, our warm southern climate is the main reason I haven't pursued a suitable outfit until now. I am leaning toward making a day dress which can be made of cotton fabric. I will talk to you about cottons and sources in more detail next month.



For now though, I'd like to show you a couple of pictures which reflect the difference in styles at both ends of our 1928-1931 spectrum of dress fashions.

There were different styles of the drop waist dress. This 1928 version shows the hip detail cinched in to add blousing to the top. In the earlier years of the 1920's the lines were very straight with no tightening at the hip.

1928 1931 ~ 11 ~

Until around 1929 the hip line was at the fullest point of the hip. In 1929 the line moved to the top of the hip. Dress lengths covered the knee cap, as pictured.

By 1930 the actual waistline was accentuated by belting or by a more fitted style. Many dresses that year also had interest at the hip (flounces, seams, etc.) in addition to actual waistline emphasis. Drop waist styles were still being shown in the catalogs as well. Hems were a couple of inches below the knee.

By 1931, the real waistline had definitely gained full popularity. Many designs featured waist seams joining skirt to bodice. Hems were about 3 inches below knee to mid-calf for daytime.

These are just some general guidelines for you to be thinking about. There are so many choices for us - Everything from porch frocks, Hooverettes, tea dresses, evening wear and beach pajamas (wide-legged pants outfits for outdoor/beach).

I have a Model A Ford Club of America pattern catalog of sewing patterns from 1925 to 1931 from which we can order actual patterns! I will bring it to each event and everyone is welcome to see what's available. I'll also bring order forms. It is my intent to provide information to our club members regarding fashions of "The Era" from a practical and fun point I don't plan to emphasize the "correctness" of fashions specific to the year of our individual Model A's. Like I said before, we can drive an old car but wear a new 1935 outfit! For any of you who are interested in being very authentic within your specific time period, I do have the "MAFCA Fashion Guidelines" available and you are welcome to peruse it. It even contains judging criteria for competitive dressing events. If you would like to order a copy for yourself (or of the pattern book), their website is mafca.com. Click on "MAFCA Store" at the top of the page. You can also look at the patterns by clicking on the left "Era Fashions", the "Pattern Project". Click on individual pattern to enlarge.



<u>More sources for vintage patterns:</u> pastpatterns.com; vpll.org. Also look on Ebay, on Amazon and on Etsy. Note that most of the patterns are copies of the original size and may need to be altered to fit.


open for visiting: Classic Car Club Museum, Pierce Arrow Museum, Franklin Museum,
