The Southside A's January Board Meeting was held on January 15, 2014 at the Los Mariachis restaurant in Fairburn.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 PM by Director Larry Peterson. The following Board members, in addition to Larry, were present: Gwyneth Shotwell, Pat Tyler, Jim Johnston, Bob Simpson, and Tom Romine.

- To be in concert with our new bylaws Larry Peterson gave a brief overview of the Board's structure and its' voting members. The voting members are Larry Peterson, Bob Simpson, Betty Miller, Jim Johnston, Gwyneth Shotwell, Tom Romine, and Pat Tyler. Past Director Tom Miller will be a non-voting advisor to the board.
- A motion was made to accept the November 2013 membership meeting minutes, which passed.
- The Treasurer's report as of December 31, 2013 shows the current account balance is \$2084.36
- We currently have 58 members (this includes 11 members delinquent for their 2014 dues)

# MARC Driving Awards 2013



Southside A's have submitted their 2013 report to the MARC Driving Awards Program. 2013 was not one of Southside A's best driving years; however, it was not at all bad, either. In fact, while several of our longer term drivers drove less than prior years, we had new comers Bob & Cheryl Simpson, and Pat & Pam Tyler, come in with very strong years. Our 2013 report included 30 cars reported for a total of 34,086 miles.

For the first time ever, we had some miles <u>disallowed</u> (1,552), due to owners <u>not renewing their MARC</u> <u>Membership for 2013</u>. Therefore, we received credit for **32,534** miles for 2013, for an all time total of **280,160**. This program is for MARC members and you must be a MARC member to participate. Also, remember our Southside A's By-Laws require members to be members of MARC!

### Some Highlights from our Club's report were:

\*30 cars reporting and 26 members registered.

\*32,534 miles allowed for 2013.

\*9 cars qualified for awards in 2013.

\*280,160 miles allowed, since our first year in 2006 (3 cars and 7,582 miles).

\*Top driver for 2013 was Tom & Betty Miller, with 5,207, (plus 415 in their A400).

\*Top driver All Time is Ray & Teri Besch with 53,264.




# **Things That Go Bump In the Night**

(And sometimes in the daytime too!)

Given their age, our Model 'A's are pretty damn reliable. This is best illustrated by the miles accumulated by Ray & Teri Besch and Tom and Betty Miller in their relatively stock/original cars. In our club, most of our 'roadside technical seminars' have involved minor glitches that were easily remedied. There are, however, a couple of original parts in our cars that may be considered high risk for failure and could potentially render your car un-drivable.

The first of these is the original fan. I think it safe to say that if you continue to operate your Model 'A' with the original fan it is not a question of 'if it fails' as much as 'when it fails'. The original fan is a fabricated part, made of several pieces welded together. The blades are hollow, and therein lies the problem. The blade(s) will rust (stress corrosion) from the inside and eventually a crack will start. Then over time the crack propagates until the blade separates from the hub. (See photo)





When this happens there is almost always collateral damage – usually to the radiator, coolant hoses, and the hood. Depending on the damage and availability of spare parts and tools, you may be looking for a trailer to get your car home. The other failure mode of these fans is less dramatic, but I have seen it several times in our club including yours truly. The front or rear half of the pulley will break away from the hub (see photo).

This can result in a loose or broken fan belt, hard to detect noise, and/or overheating. The car will be drivable, but the fan will need to be replaced.

So, what's the best preventive action here? Get that original fan off your car and replace it with one of the aftermarket options available. (NOTE: If you have an interest in either MARC Fine Point or Touring Class judging an original fan is required so you might consider trailering or installing an original fan when the car is judged.) There are two very good aftermarket fans available. If you like the original look of the two blade fan a very good one piece aluminum fan is offered. These aluminum fans were of mixed quality a few years ago, but the one offered today is very good, and they are already balanced. Another good alternate is the six blade plastic fan. They don't have the original look, but are very efficient and easy to install. A third option for you may be a steel four blade fan as offered on the later Ford cars. I'm not sure of the quality of some of these out there as I have seen a couple of them liberate blades – 'just sayin'. The choice is up to you.

# LES ANDREWS SEMINAR - January 11<sup>th</sup>

105 attendees, including eight members from the SSA's, were able to challenge the weather and see Les Andrews, to absorb the benefit from his vast knowledge of our Model "A" Fords. Leaving early AM Saturday allowed time to meet with Les and kick around a few questions prior to the seminar, even though we missed the Friday evening Welcome Dinner and Saturday





Club Breakfast.

Les's presentation focused on the stock Model A braking system, and he assured us that if we are using quality parts that are correctly installed and adjusted to spec, that stopping our A's would not be a problem. He stated that upgrading to a later hydraulic braking system would only reduce the amount of foot pressure required at the pedal. Les showed many areas that were specific to making the Model A stop with driver confidence. If you are using the

recommended Cast Iron Drums, it is necessary to use soft brake linings; old woven style or harder composition linings will not perform acceptably. An important item to check is the front actuating arm. It needs to be at a 15° forward angle. Much of the information given by Les can be found in the manuals he has created, however, getting his personal input regarding preferred parts and specific installation details helped us all improve our understanding of the braking systems.



We were also treated to a short presentation regarding tuning/timing our four cylinder Fords. Les stated, and I am hearing this more frequently, that we should be adjusting our ignition points to .018". I have personally always set them at .020". I'm anxious to see if this makes any difference in my engine performance. The only true test we can make is to set up a Dwell Meter to see if we are at the recommended 28°. I found an old Tach/Dwell Meter in the garage and will be using it to tweak my tuning soon.



After the presentations, Les was also attending to a long line of well wishers, and autographing our manuals. During lunch Paul presented Les with his assignment as an Honorary Alabama Colonel to the State Militia. Joe Spooner then presented Les with a handmade hardwood replica Model A Horn. It may be just my imagination, but I think we heard Les using the phrase "Y'all" and "recon" following lunch.




As always our Alabama comrades put together a great day and served a fine meal to prepare us for our journey home.
