





These varied outfits illustrated a craft and decorating product for enhancing a *"black* satin evening wrap or negligee, or a glorified version of the coolie coat" with brilliant colors and dramatic patterns.



Ladies could order the kits that contained a perforated stamping pattern, "bronzes" that were colored powders, and the tools to apply them. There

was a creamy plastic substance for making the overall design using a stiff flat brush, and a cone in the kit could be filled and used to create outlines and raised patterns. The bronzes were then sprinkled on the substance for color. Colors ranged from pastels to *"brilliant high colors."* Ordering was available through the magazine itself. And the results were...


Bentley Bohanan Q and A

Q: I like to drive my Model A on the weekends. Sometimes I go for a month or so without driving it at all, but it always starts right up. How much air pressure should I run in my tires?

A: Sounds like you have a good car. The more you drive it the better it will run. You are smart to think about your tire pressure, especially if you don't drive it that often. 35 psi is the correct pressure. If you run your tires low, this will adversely affect the

handling and tire wear. Keep a small air pressure gauge in the door pocket and check them every couple of weeks.

Q: Now that is getting colder outside, I'm thinking about installing a heater in my Model A. What are my options?



A: The most popular is a "Manifold Heater". There are a couple of different kinds. The first is an Autolite heater. These have not been made in many decades, but can be found. They are also known as a "waffle" heater because the manifold has a special appendage with a cast iron cover on top that heats up the air before it goes into the car. Since these manifold heaters are very old you must inspect them carefully for cracks. You don't want any exhaust

gas coming into the car with you. There is also a kit that converts your standard manifold to a heater. These are available at Mike's, for about \$90, including the heater and the door that mounts onto the firewall. Another option is to rig up a hot water type heater. This plumbs into your cooling system. This does take up some room inside the car. Whatever you do, it will make those cool mornings much more enjoyable.


Q: I have noticed that my Ahoogah horn is sounding very weak lately. It sounds more like a cow bellowing. What can I do?

A: I would guess since the horn has always worked until now, it just needs a little maintenance. Remove the back cover off the horn with the small flathead screw. Be

careful not to turn the adjustment screw, you will know the cover screw because it has a small lock washer underneath. Now you will see the Armature where the brushes run. Clean this area thoroughly with a soft cloth dampened with some WD-40. Now lubricate the ends of the Armature with some 3-in-1 oil. If you look carefully, you will see a couple of felt washers on the ends of the Armature. Just put a couple of drops of oil on these felt washers. Now try your horn again and I bet it sounds much better. You may have to turn the adjuster a click or two either way to get that desired "Ahoogah" sound once you put it back together.

MARC Driving Awards 2014


