On Saturday, January 28th, the Southside A's held a Tech Meet, hosted by Tom Romine. The subject of the meet was distributor rebuilding.



Editor's Note: Since we are interested in reviving the fun of dressing up in era styles, we're republishing a story from 2013 which can give you some hints for putting together an outfit in a variety of ways. Enjoy!

As we showed you last month in the story about the MARC Meet, the Millers and Shotwells got decked out in their era-image finest for the evening of the Fashion Show, Ice Cream Social and exhibition of fine-point and A-400 cars. The makeup of their outfits, and how they were put together, shows several of Kathie's suggestions.

First up will be the Millers, Betty and Tom:



Betty's lovely flowered dress has a perfect era feel, accented by the split sleeves and lightweight flowing fabric in a flower print. She found this fetching frock at **Ross Dress for Less**, no less! This shows that simply having an understanding of the various period styles with some of the recognizable features, allows you to spot similar aspects in many of today's dresses.

The accessories Betty put together include her straw hat found in an antique mall, dainty earrings suitable to the period, and shoes purchased at **T.J. Maxx**. Her aluminum mesh 1930's handbag was actually discovered at an antique car swap meet, on a table featuring car parts. Turns out the wife of the vendor had a few items she wanted to sell, and placed them on display. You never know where you might find the perfect accent!

Tom is decked out in a wonderful seersucker suit in pale blue and white, sometimes called an "Ice Cream Suit." This was purchased at **Jos. A Bank**; again,

current day clothing can harken back to the era, given the proper accessories. To that end, Tom added a vintage straw hat found at a flea market. He wore a pale pink Oxford shirt, and finished off his look with golf saddle shoes with the spikes removed (it only requires unscrewing them).



The Shotwells:


As you'll see on the next page, Mike is attired in an outfit combining era image with the modern day: His knickers (plus-fours) and argyle socks are from **GolfKickers.com**. The knickers are a polyester fabric, with elastic around the bottom of the pant legs. His golf cap is something that is readily found in a variety of stores, including department stores, hat stores and golf shops. His shoes, like Tom's, are golf shoes with spikes removed. The modern touch is his black polo shirt (which he wore to designate himself as the president of the A-400 club), which actually blends pretty well for the purpose of "era image."



Gwyneth made her dress from a 1930's vintage pattern purchased online at a Kathie Meyers-recommended website, **vpll.org**. (See below) It closely resembles the McCall's May, 1930 illustration of a tennis dress, seen below. Accessories include a straw cloche hat from a vintage store in Atlanta, closed sandals and small vintage-looking earrings from **Dillard's** (not expensive!), and white cotton gloves purchased that day at the fashion swap meet for \$2.00.

So, you can see that there are many ways to put together fun clothes that are even more fun to wear, either when touring, or attending a Model A function.
