



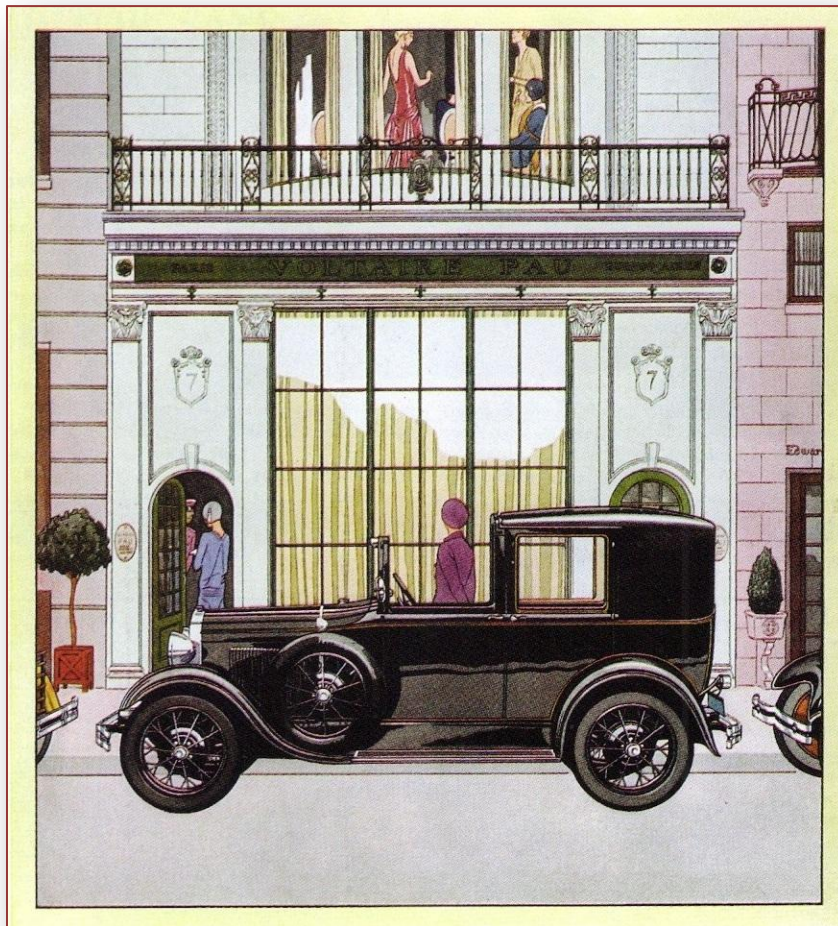

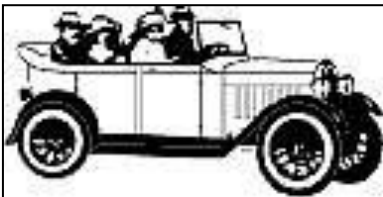

MARC Model A Mileage Awards Program



It is time for Southside A's to make our annual mileage report for MARC's Driving Awards program. If your Model A is registered in the program, please read your odometer and contact Eugene Willingham at 770 253-6518 or eewill@numail.org. Eugene must gather the reading and make our report to the National Driving Awards Chairman, so please get your odometer reading to Eugene as soon as possible.

If your Model A is not registered for this program, consider signing up. MARC established the program to encourage us to “drive our Model A”. Once your car is registered, we will report your odometer reading annually and once your car has reported 2,000 miles, you will receive a 2,000 mile award. The second award comes at 5,000 miles, and then at each 5,000 mile interval. Miles driven are cumulative. There is a \$1.00, one-time registration fee. You need to have an operating odometer. If you have any questions, contact Eugene Willingham. Southside A's are strong supporters of this program, so register and become a part of the program.

Winterizing" Your Model A

After a pleasurable year of driving your Model "A" you are probably going to let her rest for a spell until the weather improves. Our northern friends take this more seriously than we do but we should do a few minor things before closing that garage door for the winter.



This is always a good time to check your antifreeze. You can purchase a tester at most any auto parts supply store. A mix that is at zero degrees F. or below should be fine. Manufacturers recommend a 50/50 mix that generally is about -35 deg. F. You should also consider how long it has been since you changed this fluid. Manufacturers recommend changing it every two years. Most A's require additional fluid periodically so if you have been adding antifreeze 50/50 mix, not just water, you may consider three years. Keep in mind that you will still get a good below freezing reading with old fluid but the anti-corrosive and water pump lubrication additives have probably out lived their usefulness.

Now let's look at the balance of the car and consider the following before storage or a good winter rest:

Lubricate your chassis.

Change your oil.

Wash and Wax the exterior.

Check your tire pressure (35 lbs.).

Check your tires for cracking and rotate them.

Look at the tires for abnormal wear. Align the front end if needed.

Check the wheel lug torque (55 lbs.).

Check the operation of all bulbs.

Wash the windows and apply a good coat of Rain "X" to the wind shield.

Also, charge you battery to a full charge. Consider disconnecting for the season. A battery tender is good to have; it will keep your battery at full charge and extend the battery life.

If you don't have a battery disconnect switch, you may consider putting this on your wish list.

Finally, check the level of the transmission, differential and steering box. They all use 600 wt. oil or equal.

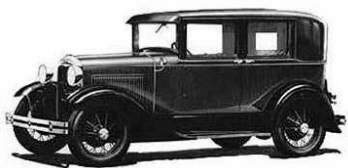

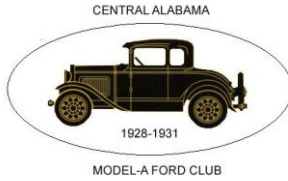

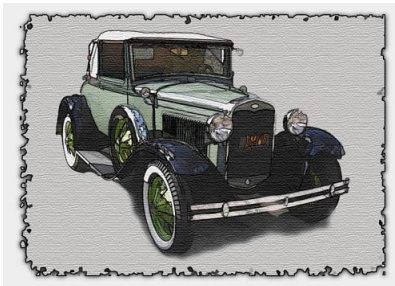
MAFCA NATIONAL TOUR: The Blue Ridge Parkway, May 6-10, 2013
