

#### History of Stately Oaks

Stately Oaks is an 1839 antebellum house listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Its plain Greek Revival architecture is representative of the era in which it was built. It was originally constructed in 1839 by Mr. Whitmill Allen who sold his home to Robert McCord in 1858 and then moved to Tyler, Texas. It is located in Jonesboro, GA., the very city where Scarlett had to pay the taxes on Tara. Even though Tara only existed in Margaret Mitchell's imagination, she placed Tara in Clayton County where she had visited relatives who lived on a large plantation south of Jonesboro. Many of the stories she heard as a child are in the movie. Clayton County is truly home of Gone With the Wind.

Just as Scarlett fought to survive the Civil War so did Rebecca McCord who resided at Stately Oaks when the Union Army converged on Jonesboro in August 1864.

Come and rock a while on the front porch! Stop by Juddy's Country Store for a bottled Coke and moon pie . . . bring back the memories of a simpler time. Arrive as visitors and depart as friends!!







# Open House at Ray & Terí Besch's

Our outing on June 4, hosted by Ray and Teri Besch, was so much more than simply a morning drive followed by fellowship and food. The well attended event began with a relaxing gathering at the Besch homestead in Peachtree City, where dish after dish filled the counters in the kitchen in anticipation of the lunch to come.

We then collected in our Model A's to follow Teri on a scenic route to Falcon Field, home of our Regional Airport. Not only does the airport serve take-offs and landings of vintage aircraft, but also planes bringing people to the area to work in our growing film and TV industry, especially at Pinewood Atlanta in nearby Fayetteville. But more interestingly, the hangars house a wide variety of WWII planes, some of which are undergoing restoration or repair. Also housed in the main hangar is a small but well filled museum housing all sorts of memorabilia from the Second World War.

It was for this reason that we ventured there this Saturday morning. Teri's Uncle Jack was a member of the 9<sup>th</sup> Armored Division which received the Presidential Unit citation for their actions in taking and defending the Ludendorff Bridge during the Battle of Remagen. His army jacket and overcoat, as well as two Nazi flags, one of which was a battle flag, were donated for display at the museum.

It was wonderful to hear about his exploits, and to have some additional insight added by our host, Willard Womack. The donation was gratefully received.

Mr. Womack then gave us a complete presentation on WWII aircraft during and after the war, as well as telling us about the Commemorative Air Force, Dixie Wing, based at the airport, of which he is a member. This is the group that restores the planes and maintains the museum. They have a huge shop any Model A-er would envy! The presentation and subsequent tour were a wonderful bonus.

Of particular interest was seeing former pilot, Jackie Peterson, gamely climb into both gun turrets on display, including a ball turret that would have been mounted under the belly of the plane. We could certainly get a feel for the cramped quarters and dangerous exposure experienced by the men who operated these important weapons. Thank you, Jackie!



Back at the ranch, we encountered Chef Ray expertly preparing hamburgers and hot dogs for the eager crowd. Paired with all the delicious side dishes and desserts, no one left hungry, that's for sure.

Thanks to the Besches for their hospitality which made for another great outing for the Southside A's.


# FASHION FINDS... By Gwyneth Shotwell

## **Smart Summer Fashions**

(Adapted from Patti Jones, MAFCA WEBSITE, Style Sources, April 1931)

The Bradley Company was a leading knit company during the Model A era. They produced out-of-door wear for the smart fashion conscious Model A'er. Vivid colors were seen in their beach and knitwear. The following could be seen on the shores of the Atlantic.

- (A) A sweater blouse in white, with lace on the yoke and sleeves. It came with a matching knit skirt, and could be bought in light blue, mauve gray, and bisque beige. Note the spectator 2-tone shoes and wide brimmed beach hat.
- (B & D) These ensembles for the beach were inspired from sailor's uniforms. In navy and white, the knitted onepiece bathing suit (D) has full knickerbockers-style trousers, <u>zipper</u> sun back and square neckline. Jersey is used for the fisherman's style shirt and pajamas in (B). The pajamas fit snuggly around the hips and fall straight down to the ground giving the pant leg a distinct flare.
- (C) This man's 2 piece suit is made in tan and brown. The suit has a trim cut top and the brief isn't tightly fitted around the legs, as in the other man's swimsuit (E).
- (E) This is the common swim suit we normally see being modeled at fashion shows for men. At public pools, these suits were offered for both men and women! It has a "skirt" over the front of the suit to hide a man's "dignity". Being wool knit, the under short fits snuggly around the legs for maximum comfort swimming.



## The Tech Corner

# Q: I'm working on my electrical system and would like to install a new ignition switch. What are my options?

A: The original which was a "Pop-out" switch. This was a sort of security system for the car. The ignition wire ran in a heavy conduit to make it difficult to "hotwire" the car. If you have an original "Pop-out" you might want to have it restored to keep the car original. There is also a reproduction pop-out which looks like the original which but doesn't really work the same. Next up is a heavy duty replacement switch. That's the one we most often used in the shop. It will last for many years and be very dependable. The last option is a very inexpensive switch, but I've had bad luck with that one over the years.

Original Pop out-This can be recognized from inside the car because there is only a small button with a place for the ignition key. When you turn the key, the button "pops out" to turn on the ignition. When you get ready to turn the car off, you simply push the button in until it locks. This action can be confusing to the uninitiated, since it is easy to leave the switch and the out position, causing the battery to go dead. Just be careful.

Repro Pop out—This switch is also a heavy duty switch. It is made to bolt in from the back of the instrument panel, like the Original Pop out. The key only turns the switch on and off. There is no "Pop out" action. However it looks original, and is a very good switch.

**Heavy duty replacement switch**— this can be recognized by the knurled nut which holds the switch to the instrument panel. This is a very good, fairly inexpensive replacement switch. We use this one most often in the shop.

**Light-duty switch**— there are thousands of these ignition switches being used, however they are a light duty switch. Eventually they will wear out, and cause problems. Mike no longer sells these switches.

**Ignition Cables:** There are also a couple of different ignition cables available. The first one is the same diameter as the original, and looks authentic under the hood. There is also a much thinner reproduction, of course at a lower price.



These are the \$89 rooms and with only four of them, they have already been reserved. Regular rooms with Queen or King beds are available at \$125 and \$134, respectively.




