

Treasurer Betty Miller reported a balance of \$1138.72 with four dues deposits pending. The Treasurers Report was accepted.





The Tech Corner

"Summertime, Summertime"

I'm no weatherman, but it seems to me like it's going to be a hot Summer! Here are a few ideas to cool off that Model A for some comfortable Summer Cruising.

Model A's are great for driving all times of the year. In the winter time we get out the quilts or throws to take the chill off. Fall and Spring are perfect for trips, with the cool air in the early mornings and late evenings requiring a jacket or hat, maybe even gloves. As the days get warmer we shed those extra layers. As temps reach the 80's we push the windshield out to let in the extra breeze. When the temps get into the 90's then we will need to make sure we have done everything to keep the engine heat out of the driver's area. Here are a few things we can check before heading out on a long Summer drive:

1) Take off that old manifold heater. If you haven't already thought of it, remove your old Autolite manifold heater top. Not all Model A's have them, but if you drive a lot in the winter then you have probably installed one. This is as simple as removing a couple of bolts, then setting the cast iron top on the work bench until Autumn. Use some aluminum HVAC (duct) tape to seal up the heater passage in the firewall. Make sure no engine heat can get though.

2) Seal up the firewall. While you have the aluminum HVAC tape out, take some time to seal up all the cracks, seams, and extra holes in the firewall. The temperature under the hood on a Summer day will stay around 200 degrees. Keeping all that heat out of the passenger compartment is the top priority. Seal around the edges of the floorboards while you are at it. Don't forget the areas behind the cowl panels.

3) Firewall Insulation. There are some really nice insulators made for the Model A's. These are pre-formed and cut to fit perfectly, and really look great when installed. You still need to do step (2) before installing the insulators. PN#'s are A-18572-A, B, or C, depending on year model. These are about \$135.

4) Floorboard insulation. You'll have to make your own insulator for the floorboards. Use heavy wool carpet liner, or the bubble wrap type insulation available at auto parts stores. Use your floor mat as a template and cut it to fit.

5) Muffler Heat Deflector. Eliminate the hot spot in the passenger floorboard with a Muffler Heat Deflector. These are available in zinc plated steel PN# A5230HS, or step up to long lasting Stainless Steel in PN# A5230HSS. Less than \$50.

6) Air Conditioning? That's right, there are complete air conditioning systems available for your Model A Ford. These use the very efficient new small compressors, along with custom made evaporators and condensers. You will need to make sure you have done all the above steps, along with converting the car to 12Volts before the Air Conditioning systems can be installed. Complete system with installation is around \$2500, but might be worth it if you really want to stay cool. Once installed you will be guaranteed some really cool cruising in your Model A Ford.

7) Ice Chest full of Cold Drinks. Simple as that, a small cooler with several bottles of water, and your favorite soft drinks will really take the edge off the summer heat.



Tour with CAMFCA To Tuskegee, Alabama - September 8





This will probably be an overnight tour, leaving Friday afternoon and returning in the afternoon on Saturday. More information to follow.


