Thoughts from Our Director

I hope this letter finds you well. As we move into the Summer months and prime days for touring in our cars, it's time to make certain that your car is mechanically ready. If you missed the last technical meeting hosted by Jim Hunter and Tom Romine you missed the perfect time to learn about keeping your car safe and ready to drive.

With the warmer weather and longer days ahead, it's crucial to ensure that your vehicle is in top-notch condition. Regular maintenance and inspections are essential to prevent any unexpected breakdowns or safety issues while touring.

Here are a few key steps you can take to ensure your car is prepared for tours.

1. Check your tires: Inspect the tread depth and tire pressure regularly. Properly inflated tires with good tread provide better traction, improve fuel efficiency, and ensure a smoother ride. Check lug nut torque before driving on a tour. Normally 55 ft pounds.
2. Test your battery: Heat can be tough on car batteries, so it's important to have your battery tested to ensure it's in good working condition. If your battery is more than a few years old, it may be worth considering a replacement.

I keep a IR standoff thermometer with me on all trips for checking not only the engine but the brakes too.

5. Maintain proper fluid levels: Regularly check the levels of essential fluids such as engine oil, steering box, transmission fluid and coolant.

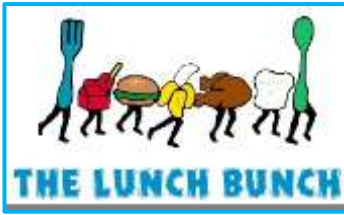

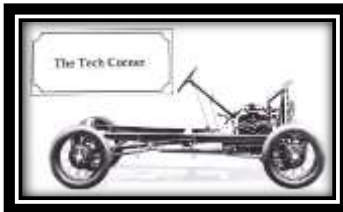

The Tech Corner

Gas Gauge Repair

There will come a time in the life of a surviving Model A when the gas gauge will need repair. The first order of business is to have the proper tools to get it apart. Model A suppliers carry them. Most repairs consist of replacing the float and the gaskets. The best choice for a float is one made of brass that modern fuels will not destroy. An excellent brass float is available from Reenlee H. Kotas of San Diego, 858-945-2018. Price in 2020 was \$6. Gaskets and brass slip rings can be obtained from Bratton's.

Gas gauge gaskets 13570 \$2.50 set
 Brass slip rings 13571 \$1.15 each



The original Ford installation required only one brass slip ring. However, in the modern Model A kingdom it has been determined that at least two (or more) slip rings are required to prevent a fuel leak. With only one slip ring the outer nut will likely bottom on the threads before there is a crush on the gaskets. The drawing below shows two brass slip rings. It is also suggested that cork gaskets be used. Avoid the neoprene gaskets as modern fuels are likely to destroy them.

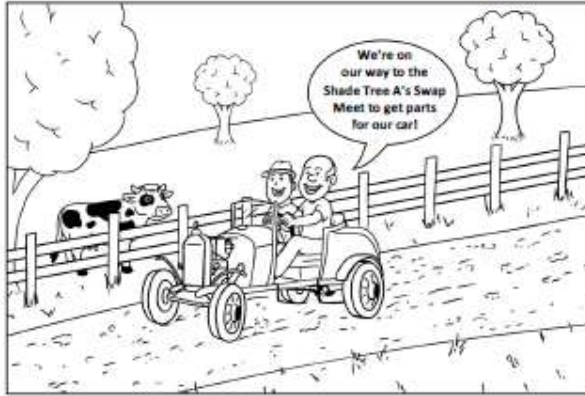

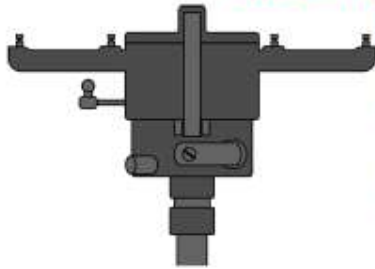

FASHION FINDS...

From Gwyneth Shotwell

This month we have page 3 of 5 in our “Stepping out in Style” shoe review. Here we learn about the different types and styles of shoes for dancing and dress-up, again with what I think are really delightful illustrations. More to come next month.

(Thanks once again to Lynda Davis, Dallas and Fort Worth Model A Clubs, and the MAFCA website.)

For evening wear, Cuban heels were often affixed extravagantly with “rhinestones, mock tortoiseshell or cloisonné enamel” (Cox, *Vintage Shoes* 31) (see the above image of three rhinestone heels. The Cuban is at the left, and Louis heels are center and right). One distinguishing feature of the Cuban is that oftentimes the heel is a “knock-on,” which means “the sole leather does not continue down the [shoe’s] breast, but rather the heel is constructed completely, then attached, with no further crafting” (*American Duchess*).

The Military Heel:

The Military heel, “built upon the Cuban design” (*The Shoe Retailer*, 77), is almost a twin to the Cuban. With straight sides and back line, it doesn’t taper like the Cuban does. While it throws the foot a little forward, it is more supportive because the surface area at the cap is larger than the Cuban. For these reasons, it is a popular heel for women’s walking and sport shoes, cowboy boots, and children’s shoes. Initially, the Military heel was a low or short heel. The 1921 *Merchandise Manual for Shoe Departments* describes the heel as never exceeding the height of the Cuban. By the Model A era, however, catalogues and periodicals show Military heels mirroring the height of the Cuban.



Louis Heel (Sometimes called the French Heel):

This article treats the Louis and French heels together as identical. In fact, the *Merchandise Manual for Shoe Departments* reports that “some shoe men say that the French and the Louis XV heels are practically the same.” The heel is named for King Louis XV of France; later, due to the inward curve at the heel’s waist and its resemblance to a thread spool, it achieved the nickname “the spooled heel.” By 1928, the hour-glass shape became less pronounced, more subtle and not as exaggerated as its earlier styles (see image below, a pair of Model A era Louis/French heels displayed at The Met in New York.) As a result, distinguishing between the Louis and the Cuban heels can be challenging. Often taller and thinner than the Cuban, this heel has a distinctive flirty curve, flaring out just above the heel cap. This style is popular with professional dancers, and era-image options are easily found in dance-shoe stores.

Have you ever wondered what being a Trustee for the Model A Ford Foundation is all about?

The Model A Ford Foundation has 15 Trustees and the positions are nonpaid. Terms are three years in duration and term limits are 6 consecutive years. Meetings are done via Zoom, but there is a day-long face-to-face meeting in Michigan two days prior to Model A Days each year (also, travel expenses are non-reimbursable; this is 100% volunteer work).

A sampling of duties include: creating and ordering signage at the museum for displays and events, programming and maintaining inventory, and financials-- some daily. There are several committees to be chaired and worked on: day-to-day museum management, finance, fundraising, the construction expansion, the design and development of the displays, insurance, assession/deassession of vehicles, fleet maintenance, social media, solicitation of parts, tool acquisition and inventory, by-laws and job description updates, advisory, and

partner museum liaisons as well as Model A Days each year (which has a huge number of subcommittees from parking to staffing the gates to managing the swap meet, the first start program, riding and driving Model A's). There are always a variety of other projects that need a manager too (ie: bus restoration, booth displays at meets, library collections, period attire collections as well as developing national magazine articles and ideas.)

Individuals also serve as officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer and a variety of other tasks: MAFFI registrar, picking up and delivering vehicles, managing gift shop items, updating and maintaining the MAFFI website and IT systems within the museum.

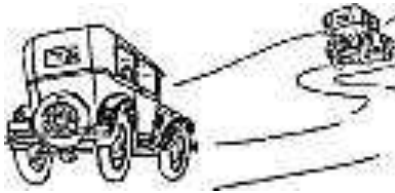
