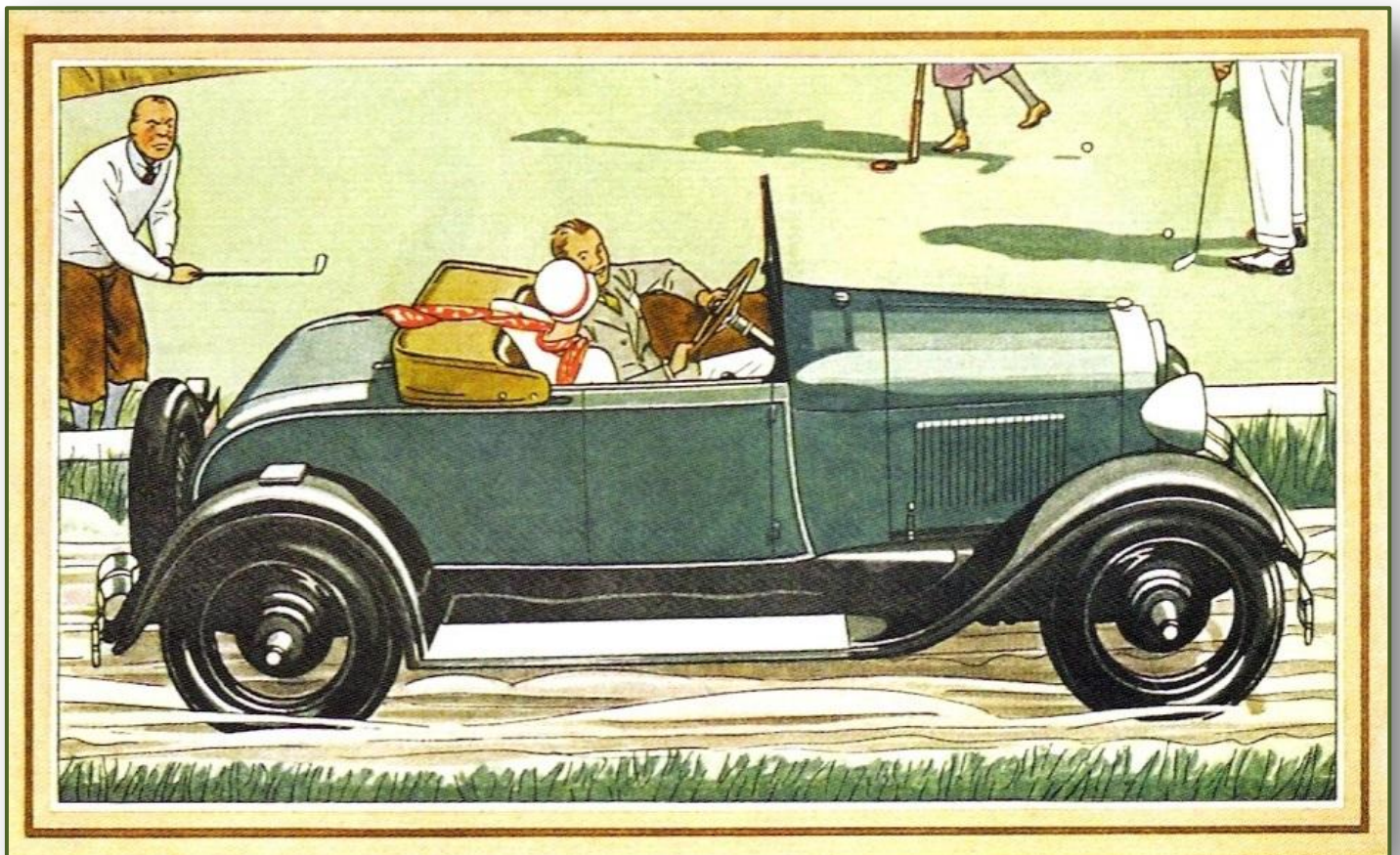

Minutes of Board of Directors Meeting

The SSA's February Board Meeting was held on February 8th at the home of Phil & Kathie Meyers.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05PM by Director Phil Meyers. The following members were present: Tom & Betty Miller, Eugene Willingham, Phil & Kathie Myers, Mike & Gwyneth Shotwell, Jim & Jackie Johnston, and Paul Beeghly.

The January 2012 Board meeting minutes were accepted pending a minor correction. (Motion by Gwyneth Shotwell, seconded by Jackie Johnston)

Treasurer Betty Miller reported a balance of \$1254.89 with one dues deposit pending. A Motion to accept the treasurer's report was made by Tom Miller and seconded by Eugene Willingham.

Committees:

Membership: We currently have 39 members. Four members (Bookwalter, Grubbs, Nowak and Shiffert) did not renew their membership for 2012 and will be dropped from the Roster and e-mail

distribution lists accordingly. An updated Roster will be sent out to members.

Corresponding secretary: Eugene has submitted one article to the MARC National Newsletter. Eugene also commented on the 2011 mileage numbers. 2011 was the biggest year ever with 51688 miles driven by the 24 members registered, and 12 members qualifying for awards.

Newsletter: Mike & Gwyneth have done some research on the printing and mailing of the Newsletter to members that do not have internet access. With the Newsletter now averaging 18 pages the cost to print and mail the Newsletter is approximately \$65 - \$70/yr. per member. Other options are being explored including black & white printing, and asking member Jason Carne if he could help with the printing. Going forward Eugene Willingham has volunteered to print and mail the Newsletter as required.

Phil Meyers reported the he will need to 'massage' his plans for an overnight tour to the Forsyth, GA area. Phil is trying to condense an older Social Security Tour from three day to two. The tour originally planned for April 27 - 28 will be rescheduled when the details are finalized. Jim Hunter and Phil will be working on this as time permits.

Old Business: There was no old business discussion.

New Business: The SSA's received a letter from Mike Butcher (Mike's "A" Ford-able Parts) inquiring about placing a business card size ad in the Newsletter. “Technical Q & A”

Hope everyone is enjoying their Model A's. I just fueled up “Ole Bullet” and it took over \$35 of gas! I only joined the club in 1995, and it was impossible to put in over \$10 worth. So my thoughts this month are on fuel economy. Recently a friend asked:

Q: How many miles per gallon should my Model A get?

The Model A was advertised to get between 20-30 mpg. Even though fuel was only 25 cents a gallon back then, fuel economy was still important to the owners. I have actually never gotten 30 mpg out of our Model A, but 17-18 mpg should be easy. Here are a few hints to maximize your gas mileage.

- Keep your engine tuned properly- clean spark plugs and set ignition points at .018”
- Remove the air cleaner, especially if you are running the paper type, this causes a tremendous restriction on your carburetor, resulting in poor mileage.
- “Read” the spark plugs- if they are consistently black and sooty, then the carb jetting is too rich, and you are using too much fuel.
- Make sure your coil is strong, use a spark gap tester PN# T12117, and polarity tester PN# T12116, if in doubt, install a new coil. PN# A12000.
- Make sure you are using a copper coil high tension lead, do not use a graphite or radio suppression type coil wire.
- Valves should seal properly. Use a compression tester, all cylinders should be able to produce 60 psi of pressure. If your compression is low, you may need a valve job.
- Consider a high-compression head, this will increase your mileage by 5-10 %.
- Make sure your wheels are aligned properly- watch for uneven wearing of tread, set toe-in to 1/16”.
- Adjust brakes so there is little or no drag, you should be able to push the car easily on level ground. (just make sure you can still stop safely!)
- Set tire pressure to 35 psi.
- The single most important aspect of fuel economy is driving habits. Pretend like there is an egg on the accelerator pedal, try not to crack that egg while driving.
- If you really want to get serious, install a vacuum gage. Drive so the gage reads a strong vacuum signal, this indicates that the throttle is closed as much as possible during all driving conditions.

1st Annual Valentine's Sweetie Tour



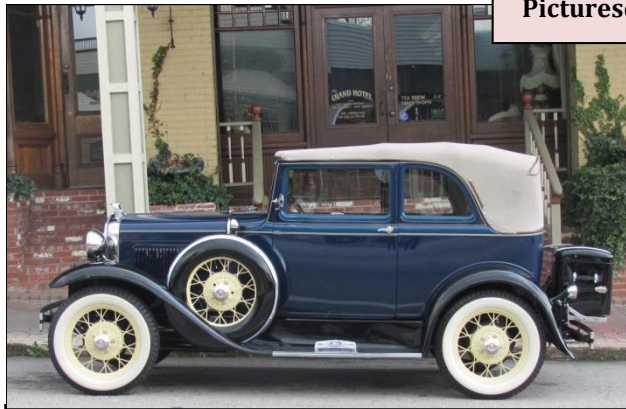

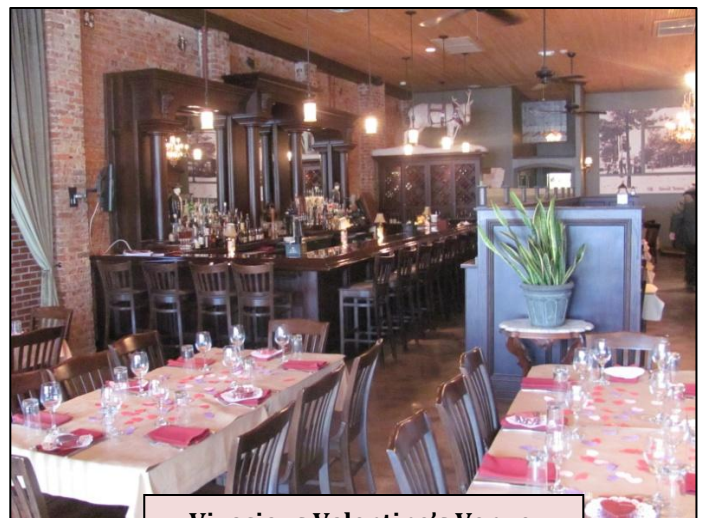

Horseless Carriage Club

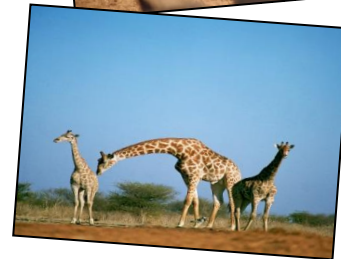

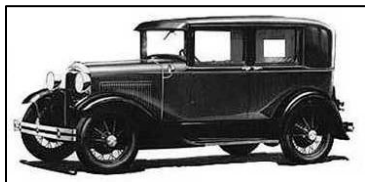

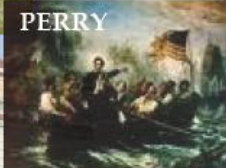


Fort Meigs

The Whitehouse A's extends to all, an invitation to enjoy the hospitality and history of Northwestern Ohio. Our Host Hotel is the **Hilton Garden Inn** located in the Town Center at Levis Commons, in Perrysburg, Ohio, just across the Maumee River from Maumee and Toledo, Ohio.

The **City of Perrysburg**, founded in 1810, was named to honor Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry's victory over a superior British fleet during the 1813 Battle of Lake Erie, and symbolized by the

Commodore Perry statue on Main Street. Just a few blocks away is the reconstructed and historically accurate **Fort Meigs**, built by our future President, General William Henry Harrison. Stop in the museum and walk within the fort to experience what military life was like in the early 1800's.

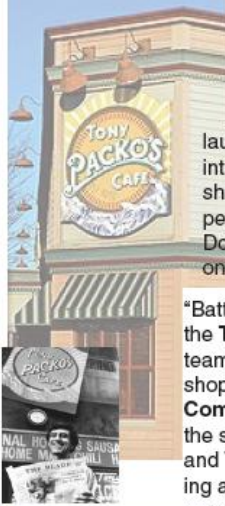

If your interest goes more toward ships, than you can't miss touring the Great Lakes Museum Freighter,

Colonel James M. Schoomaker,

launched in 1911, it was the "worlds largest bulk freighter", the interior furnishing rivaled such magnificent trans-Atlantic steamships as the Lusitania and Olympic. After touring the ship, perhaps a stop at **Tony Packo's Café** for a "Hungarian Hot Dog". Packo's was made famous by **Jamie Farr** as "Klinger" on the TV show M.A.S.H.



"Batter Up", how about taking in a home opener of the **Toledo Mud Hens**, the Detroit Tigers AAA farm team, in their beautiful new downtown stadium. If shopping is what you like, try the shops in **Levis Commons**; visit the **Libbey Glass Outlet** in Toledo, the shops and antique stores in Perrysburg, Maumee and Toledo. 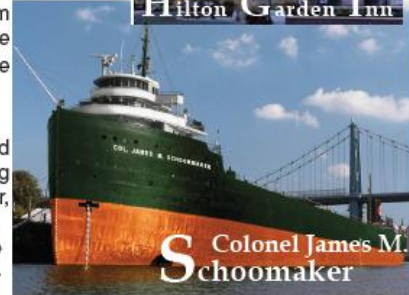
