## **Notes from Our Director**

The Fall chill will soon be in the air and with it comes thoughts of winterizing our A Model automobiles. It's a good time to check:

- Both the upper and lower radiator hoses and clamps
- Coolant quality and capacity
- Battery acid and water cell levels
- Lubricant fluid levels
- Fuel level along with stabilizing additives
- Tire pressure

Winterizing in the Deep South is not as critical as in the colder reaches of our great United States but taking these few precautions can make for easier preparation come the beginning of the touring season. If our intention is to "store" the old cars for the cold season, then an ounce of prevention can indeed be worth a pound of cure. If our intention is to take the occasional drive, we can practice normal routine maintenance.

No greater controversy exists than in the area of fuel stabilization, but it remains a good practice if for no other reason than we can never predict the weather and, as happened last year, almost two months were lost to a cold snap. Even though I intended to drive monthly, the cars and tractors sat longer than planned. Those fuel tanks, lines and carburetors that weren't drained or stabilized might have gummed up.

Whether one embraces ethanol fuels or not they are, for the most part, the reality which we have to accept. Their higher alcohol content however does provide an added benefit in helping to minimize water vaporization and fuel line freeze-up.

Taking the time to pamper the vehicles now will pay dividends down the road and certainly make for an easier start up come Spring when we're itchin' to get going. Every preventive step we take is no guarantee but it can result in less anxiety later on. It just makes good sense.


### Also celebrating our club's 25th year!

# Highlights from the October Board Meeting

The Southside A's October Board Meeting was held on October 1st at Sprayberry's Barbecue restaurant in Newman.

The meeting was called to order at 6:55 PM by Director Larry Peterson. The following members, in addition to Larry were present: Mike & Gwyneth Shotwell, Jim & Jackie Johnston, Bob Simpson, Tom & Betty Miller, Pat Tyler, Tom & Liz Romine, Eugene Willingham.

Prior to the start of the meeting Eugene Willingham asked for a few minutes to address the Board. Eugene has noted instances where our club's name, **Southside A's**, is not always used (spelled) correctly. Example **South Side A's**, and **SouthSide A's**. Eugene feels that as our club grows in size and prominence all members should be more diligent in using the correct spelling. As this year marks the Regions 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary Gwyneth Shotwell will mention this in a short article noting the anniversary in the November Newsletter.

- Membership Report Jim Johnston noted that the application from Greg Marshall was approved via email. Jim presented two applications to the Board for approval. The applications from Jett Gunn and Don & Deborah Pelham were approved. This brings our total membership to (60). Jim also asked the board for comments on sending 2015 Membership Renewal Forms to the membership. - Annual Membership Meeting & Christmas
  Party Larry Peterson and Bob Simpson
  confirmed that venues for these events have
  been reserved. Gwyneth Shotwell will put
  together a slide show to run continuously during
  the Annual Business/Membership Meeting.
- Other Events Larry Peterson asked whether or not non SSA's local events such as 'pay-to-enter' car shows, cruises. etc. be published in the Newsletter. It was agreed that this would be up the Editor's discretion as space permits.
- Other Business Larry Peterson asked that the Club's affiliation with MARC & MAFCA be made clear on the website and that an application to MAFCA should also be available. 



## The Tech Corner

## Number Eight!

The #8 head stud on a Model A Ford head has some unique features designed around it that can cause some grief if not given proper consideration. Henry designed an anti-theft system that involves the #8 stud that is still fool proof in the modern day. His arrangement makes it very difficult to hot-wire a Model A Ford ignition circuit.

An armored cable that runs from the ignition key pop-out assembly to the distributor protects the integrity of the battery voltage to the ignition points, and prevents insertion of a hotwire. The ignition key assembly also when switched off puts a ground on the arm of the points further protecting the system. The armored cable is secured to the head by a clamp attached to the #8 stud. In order to remove the distributor for repair (or to hot wire the ignition) it is necessary to unscrew the nut from the #8 stud, to release the cable.

All 14 head bolt nuts should have been previously torqued down evenly to the proper torque specification. It is not a good idea to break the torque on any one head stud as it can allow the head to warp and start leaking water. Many a Model A owner has discovered this during a roadside seminar when the #8 stud nut was unbolted and removed in order to replace the distributor.

Some Model A owners do not clamp the armored cable down to the #8 stud so they will have the ability to remove the distributor without having to break the torque on the #8 stud. However, this creates another problem. The #8 stud is slightly longer than the other studs to allow room for the clamp. With the clamp not in place the nut can bottom out on the end of the threads of the stud and give a false indication of a proper torque.

The #8 stud sits right next the narrow area between the #3 and #4 cylinders where the head gasket is very narrow and susceptible to blowing. The area between #3 and #4 cylinders is the most common area for a head gasket to blow even when there is proper torque on the stud. Removing the nut at #8, or running without the spacing of the clamp only adds to the possibility of blowing a head gasket and warping the head. The best solution is to remove the clamp completely from the armored cable and install a spacer under the nut at the #8 stud to properly space it. Torque all the head bolts down to the proper specification in sequence, and don't fool with them when out on the road. The #8 stud can also be replaced with a standard length stud as used in the other stud positions.
