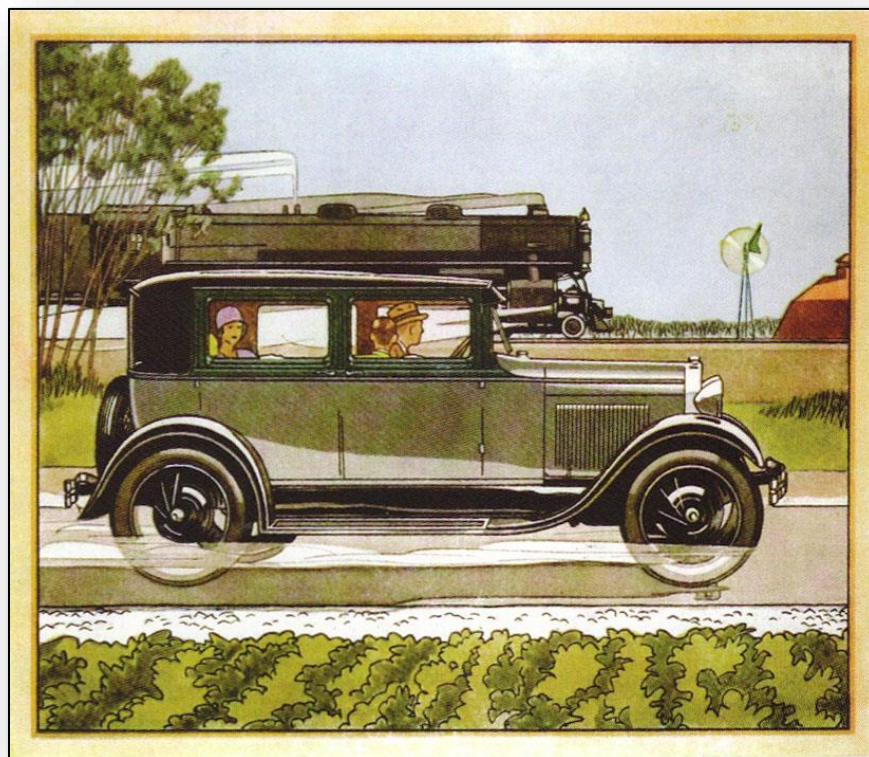

Hello everyone,

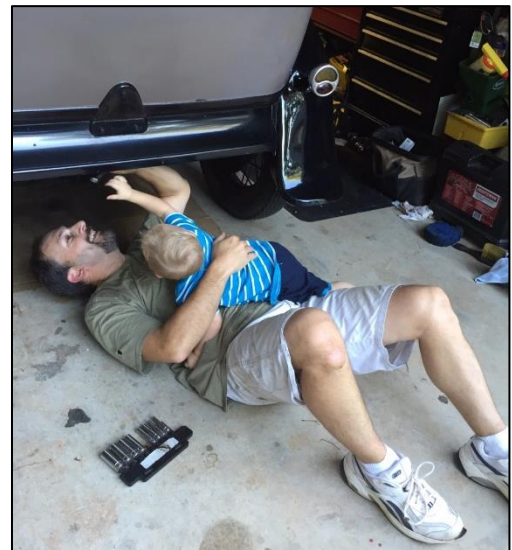

I believe this is the best time of year for touring. As I am writing this, the fun with Dick and Jane tour is rapidly approaching and I am working to prepare a car for the tour.

I decided to borrow my friend's 31 Fordor sedan for this trip so that Tina and I could bring little Gary along with us. The plan was simple... borrow the Fordor, install a seatbelt in the back to secure a child's car seat, and enjoy the trip. Not so fast! I picked up the Fordor on Sunday evening in Loganville, GA and drove it home without incident. 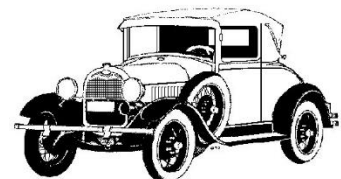
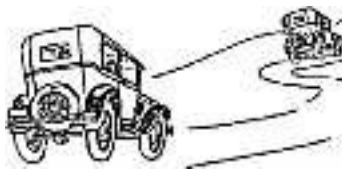

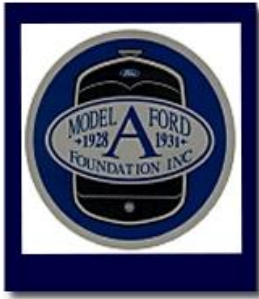

Cooling tips for summer weather – Part 2:

(Editor's note: Here are follow-up questions that relate to the cooling equipment article from last month.)

Q: I was driving my Model A the other morning when it started overheating. Water was splashing on the windshield, so I pulled over immediately. My temperature gauge only read 140°, and it really wasn't low on water. What's going on?

A: My guess is your car is really not overheating, you just have a faulty radiator cap. Water can escape around the cap during normal driving. Examine the gasket on the radiator cap to see if it is cracked or even gone. This is especially a problem on a Quail or Moto-meter, which depend on rubber seals. These seals and gaskets can be purchased inexpensively and with a little work you can solve the problem.

Q: My Model A seems to use water excessively. Every time I drive it I have to add at least ½ gallon. Where is it going?

A: Your problem might be more serious. First I would check for a leaky head gasket. This can be done by performing a pressure test on the cylinder block. Here at the shop we do this by capping off the radiator hoses. Then we put 5 pounds of air pressure in the cooling system. The test fixture has a gauge that you can watch to see if it is losing pressure. If it is losing pressure then you probably have a leaky head gasket or perhaps even a crack in the head or block.

Q: Okay, I've done the pressure test and don't seem to be losing any pressure. What do I do next?

A: I'm afraid the next thing you will have to try is the Radiator. When I first got my 1928 Roadster Pickup, I used to ride around with a 5-gallon container of water in the back of the truck. Every time I stopped I would put a little water in the radiator. This got old pretty quick. First I had the radiator serviced at a local radiator shop. When this didn't help I broke down and purchased a new Brassworks radiator. It was about \$700, but it solved the problem once and for all. The truck has been on the road for many years with no more overheating or water loss problems.

Good luck with your cooling system this summer!

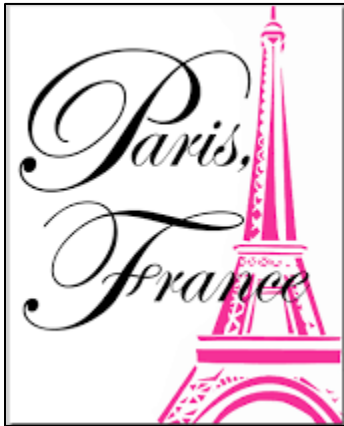

The December, 1928 issue of *McCall's Magazine*, in its regular section featuring fashions and sewing patterns, focused on the latest daytime ensembles coming out of Paris.

These two fetching outfits were a two-piece take on the prevailing one-piece frocks that were getting so much attention at the time. These examples had the one-piece look but skillfully utilized a long, hip hugging jacket to not only achieve the elongated, flattering line so desirable, but also allowed the flexibility of removing the jacket when weather permitted.

The outfit on the left: One of the new jacket frocks has a skirt pleated in the front and a jacket cleverly cut to form a rounded bolero in the back. The neckline is a low V, revealing the vest.

On the right: A skirt shirred in the front is combined with a hip length jumper with raglan sleeves and a novel neckline. A flat belt marks the waistline and forms a slight blouse.

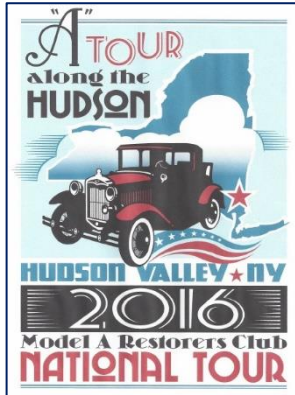


